

HALL ST HELENA WINERY

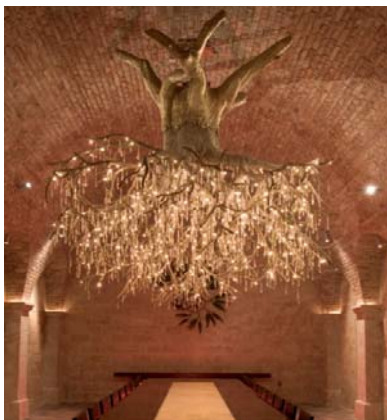


HALL St. Helena winery, a historic Napa Valley winery originally founded in 1885, was long known as the Napa Valley Co-op, was one of the primary winemaking facilities in Napa for much of the last century. When Craig Hall discovered the neglected winery property south of St. Helena in 2003, he was struck with a compelling epiphany: The shabby location, with 14 acres of vineyard, should be transformed into a world-class winemaking facility and visitor experience. The historic buildings on the property would be returned to their former glory, a state-of-the-art gravity-fed winery would be constructed, and new facilities would be built to serve as an example of the Hall's commitment to the environment.

In July of 2009, HALL St. Helena received the prestigious Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED®) Gold Certification for its Napa Valley St. Helena winery, becoming the first winery in California to be distinguished as a Gold certified facility by the U.S. Green Building Council's LEED® Green Building Rating System™.

The winery is located just south of the town of St. Helena on Route 29 and welcomes guests daily from 10am until 5:30pm for visits and tastings. The HALL Hospitality team is comprised of knowledgeable sommeliers who deliver a warm and insightful experience. Private historic tours and rare barrel tastings are also available by appointment.

HALL RUTHERFORD WINERY



A spectacular hand-built cave network and a high-tech, small-lot winemaking facility are the hallmarks of Craig and Kathryn Hall's Rutherford winery. The Halls purchased the Sacrashe vineyard in Rutherford—a vineyard that has produced prized fruit for many legendary wines—in 1995 where they built HALL Rutherford winery along with their Napa Valley home.

Nestled at the base of the Halls' 34-acre vineyard on the eastern hillside of the Napa Valley and commanding a spectacular valley view, this state-of-the-art gravity-flow winery is dedicated solely to hand-crafted small-lot and single vineyard red wines, with the capacity to make approximately 6,500 cases of wine per vintage.

The winery's 14,000 square feet of barrel caves were designed and hand-built by master mason Friedrich Gruber of Gutenstein Austria. The caves are finished with handmade Austrian brick and limestone that were recovered from sites in and around Vienna. In addition to aging wine in barrel in a precise climate, the caves showcase select works from the Halls' art collection. Deep inside the caves resides a dazzling reception area for private tastings and entertaining. The unique room is appointed with grand works of art from the Hall's collection and a spectacular chandelier of 1500 Swarovski crystals designed by Donald Lipski and Jonquil LeMaster.

The Rutherford winery is open daily by appointment only, and offers guests a highly customized winery experience through tours, demonstrations and special barrel tastings of small lot wines. Combining an intimate, home-like reception salon, sweeping views of Napa Valley, cutting-edge winemaking technology, and myriad fine art throughout, HALL Rutherford is a striking venue in which to experience HALL's hand-crafted wine portfolio.
